


# Writing a Blog

This session is about how to easily set up a free blog, and in particular, a travel blog. Blogs are very simple websites that can be for any publishing purpose. The focus is about managing your blog on an iPad or other tablet because of portability. The recommended software is Wordpress which includes a huge range of options, features and cost levels. There are many other platforms that do a good job.

For a travel blog, photos are important and managing photos on the go is addressed as an important function.

Anyone with reasonable familiarity with computers, iPad or similar tablet can manage a blog. For those who might be interested for a different purpose blog such as a family history, report on a topic, or sharing forum for a club or group, the presentation will be quite relevant.
